Companies are now focusing on the ethical selection of materials, aesthetic and formal research, and finishes and productive processes aimed at both quality and durability. More and more, the various elements composing modern beds are made to be detachable, recyclable, and certified. Pieces developed to be resistant, light, hygienic and healthy: all values shared by producers and users, expressed through the highest craftsmanship. Let's take a closer look at the leading brands.

Modern beds: Yume by Alf DaFrè

The modern Yume bed in wood and upholstery designed by Gordon Guillaumier for Alf DaFrè is highly sustainable. Every element that composes the headboard and bed frame can be disassembled, making it easy to repair the individual pieces and recycle materials correctly, from the FSC — Forest Stewardship Council — certified wood to the metallic parts sourced from virtuous reuse. Its double-density polyurethane padding is coupled and no longer glued directly to the wooden frame, while the upholstery can be selected from a range of different colors. The latter is not only completely removable but also made from Reviva fabric, an innovative material obtained from recycled plastic that's 100% recyclable, fireproof and washable.
